Preserving Our Heritage

A Proposal for the Repair and Restoration of Fairfield's Historic Building (1857)

Introduction

The historic building on Empire Street stands as one of Fairfield's oldest and most treasured landmarks, a symbol of resilience and community spirit. Originally built in 1857, the church was tragically destroyed by an earthquake on September 12, 1892. However, just two months later, on November 9, 1892, the new church—still standing proudly today—was constructed as a testament to the enduring faith and determination of the people of Fairfield.

For over 165 years, this building has witnessed the unfolding of our town's history, serving as a beacon of hope and continuity. As the seat of Solano County, Fairfield is rich in history, and this church remains a cornerstone of our heritage. However, time has taken its toll, and the building now requires urgent repairs and restoration to preserve it for future generations.




The Historical Value

Why This Restoration Matters




Cultural Significance: The church is a rare surviving example of mid-19th century architecture in Fairfield. Its preservation is crucial to maintaining the character and identity of our town.

Community Legacy: Restoring this building is about more than bricks and mortar; it's about preserving the stories and memories that have shaped our community.

Educational Value: The church can serve as a historical landmark, providing future generations with a tangible link to Fairfield's past.





The Restoration Plan

To restore the church to its former glory, we have outlined a detailed plan that will be carried out in stages. Each stage addresses critical areas of the building that need repair or restoration.



Stage 1: Repair Roof Leaks, Stop Wood Rot, and Address Eave Damage

- **Scope:** Repair all eaves, address wood rot to prevent further deterioration, and install new gutters
- Estimated Cost: \$15,000 \$20,000
- Status: Moreno Roofing has generously agreed to donate labor for this project.



Stage 2: Exterior Repairs

- **Scope:** Replace broken stain glass. Repair main doors, replace the secondary door. Repaint trim and doors (white). Install plexiglass to protect all windows.
- Estimated Cost: \$15,000

Stage 3: Tower Restoration

- Scope: Restore the tower, replace or repair broken windows, rebuild crosses, address wood single where needed, repaint all trim. Interior – add attic ladder inside tower for access.
- Estimated Cost: \$100,000 \$125,000
- Additional Needs: Rental of a Snorkel lift at \$1,000 per day for up to 30 days.

Stage 4: Roof Replacement



- **Scope:** The original cedar singles are covered by three layers of old singles, requiring extensive labor to remove. With a building 166 years old, there will be underlying wood and truss damage. Replace with a modern shingle to resemble old look.
- Estimated Cost: \$200,000 \$300,000



Stage 5: Stairs, Foundation and Signage

- **Scope:** Repair cracks on concrete stairs and still exploring foundation repairs. Replace signage with new sign explaining historical significance.
- Estimated Cost: To Be Determined






Stage 6: Miscellaneous Upgrades

- **Scope:** Repair leak damage and paint inside ceiling under the tower. Simple makeover to main entrance ways. Additional necessary repairs and enhancements as identified during the restoration process.
- Estimated Cost: \$25,000
